## Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Program

Additionally, to carry out this commitment to our Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Plan, we have designated Angie Johnson as our EEO/AAP Coordinator, who will have the responsibility to develop and thereafter maintain the necessary programs, records, and reports to comply with all government regulations and with the goals and objectives of our EEO/AAP Program.
